# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year! We are excited to have you back, and for those new to us, welcome! Grandview is a special place, and it is this community that has made it and kept it this way for going on 27 years. The start of the school year is arguably the best time of the year. Everyone comes back refreshed and ready for a new year, and this year is no different.

Like last year, we will start with two Phase-In Days. Monday, August 12th is 9th grade orientation only (a separate email to freshman families will be coming). Freshmen will learn about Grandview, walk their schedules, and briefly meet their teachers. On Tuesday, August 13th, all students will return for an 8-period, half day to walk their full schedules and meet with their teachers. On Wednesday, August 14th, we will begin our alternating Blue/Black schedule. The Phase-In Days' Schedule and the Blue/Black Calendar are attached to the email with this letter. You can also find both on our website.

Again, this year we will ask that all students enter school in the morning and throughout the day through the two main entrances (lower Athletics/Activities entrance – Door #13; upper Main entrance – Door #1) because both are staffed with security personnel. The upper bridge door will also be open in the morning for those coming off the bus. We ask that all adults and visitors enter through the upper Main entrance (Door #1). Parents, please help us encourage students to leave early enough to be dropped off or park in time to get in the building and to class on time.

Back-to-School Night is Tuesday, August 13th. You will be able to come and meet your student's teachers and get to know Grandview. More information on that was sent via email earlier this week.

Please make sure all Cherry Creek School District and GHS-specific check-in items are complete, including paid fees/fines, so that your student is ready to go day one. Schedules will be sent home via email the week of August 5th if all items are complete.

We are ready for the new year and look forward to having your students here in a few short weeks! On behalf of our entire faculty and staff, welcome back! And to our new families, welcome to the Pack! At Grandview, we are One Pack!

Dear Parents and Incoming 9<sup>th</sup> Graders:

Welcome to Grandview High School! We are looking forward to meeting you at our 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Orientation Link Crew Assembly and simulated day on Monday, August 12, 2024. Link Crew is Grandview High School's way of welcoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders to GHS and helping students make a successful transition into high school. We hope this letter answers some of the questions you may have regarding orientation and becoming a new student at Grandview.

The 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Orientation is mandatory for all incoming freshman. This is a freshman only event, so please, no parents. Plan to arrive at school by 8:05am; gym doors will open at 8:15 for students to find their name tag. If you ride the bus, they will be running on their usual times and routes. Transportation should mail routes in early August. If you have transportation questions, please call transportation at (720) 886-7400. The assembly takes place in the main gym. Come in either the front main entrance (Door 1) or the cafeteria entrance (Door 13) and people will direct you to where you need to be. **Please do not bring any backpacks, i-pods, schedules, or any other materials on this day.** All we need is you!

You will participate in a fun, spirited assembly, followed by a small group session with your Link Leaders. Link Leaders are juniors and seniors who are excited to welcome you to Grandview and will give you important information about your new school and community while helping you adjust to high school life and meet new friends along the way! We hope you will get to know your Link Leader and enjoy a friendship with them throughout the school year.

After the small group sessions, we will have time for lunch. **School lunch will be provided from the school cafeteria (you must know your PIN number)** or you can bring your own lunch. In the afternoon, **you will receive your class schedule**, attend shortened class periods so that you can find your classrooms, and meet your teachers. The school day will end at 3:30 pm, so please plan on being picked up from school at that time. If you ride a bus, busses depart at 3:40 pm and will run their regular routes.

A Link Leader, upperclassmen, will contact you a few days prior to Orientation. **The Link Leader will be calling the number that was provided on the parent forms.** We realize that most times this is a parent/guardian number. Leaders will identify themselves and ask to talk to your student to welcome them personally and answer any questions they may have.

# ATHLETIC REGISTRATION

All athletes must complete the athletic registration process and be cleared through the Athletic Department before participating in the CHSAA season. Athletic Registration is open for all Fall Sports. Winter and Spring sports will be open for registration later in the school year. Completed registration must consist of the following:

1. Online registration (information about the process is at the end of this message).
2. CHSAA approved physical form. (Physicals are good for one year. Physical forms can be downloaded from the Athletic Registration page, and hard copies are in the Athletics Office at Grandview. Pages 1-2 will provide a history of the athlete's health. Pages 3 and 4 MUST be signed and dated by a physician. If you are having trouble getting in for a physical before the deadline of registration, see the information below and the attachment for physicals through UC Health.)
3. Payment of \$90 athletic fee.

Boys' Golf will begin their season on August 5, 2024. To ensure athletes are processed and able to participate on the first day of practice/tryouts, online registration must be completed and cleared through the Grandview Athletic Department by the end of the day on July 29, 2024.

Cross Country, Field Hockey, Football, Gymnastics, Boys' Soccer, Softball, Cheers, Poms, Boys' Tennis, and Girls' Volleyball will begin their season on August 12, 2024. To ensure athletes are processed and able to participate on the first day of practice/tryouts, online registration must be completed and cleared through the Grandview Athletic Department by end of the day on August 5, 2024.

## Directions to Complete Online Athletic Registration:

If NEW to Grandview (ALL FRESHMEN), please follow these steps:

- Go to Grandview High School home page, click on Athletics, then Athletic Registration. You should be at this link <https://grandviewhs-ar.schooltoday.com>.
- Click on the Wolf Head.
- Scroll down to "Create Family Account."
- It will ask you for your student's last name exactly how it is in PowerSchool (if your student is a Jr or the III this will need to be added or the system will not accept the last name) and Student ID.
- Next will ask for an email and password. The system will send an email notification to activate your account. Once activated, you will then go back and log in with your credentials.
- The registration will take about 10 minutes.
- If you have a physical for your child, please upload this in the proper section.
- The last step is to pay \$90.
- Click Submit and this will link your student to your family account.

## Process for all returning athletes:

- Go to Grandview High School home page, click on Athletics, then Athletic registration. You should be at this link <https://grandviewhs-ar.schooltoday.com>.
- Click on the Wolf Head.
- Scroll down to "Family Account Login." Use your username and password that you used last year.
- Once you are in your account, click on the blue "Register" and then your student's name.
- This will prompt you to start the registration process for the new school year.
- At the physical section, please add a new physical.
- The last step is to pay \$90.
- Click Submit.

## DEANS' CORNER

Please excuse absences within 48 hours of absence and utilize the attendance line numbers. Excused absence means the student should be out of the building and off campus. Thank you for your support.

Grandview High School is a closed campus during the school day for all 9th graders, meaning 9th graders are not permitted to leave campus at any time. It is strongly encouraged (but not required) 10th graders remain on campus during regular school hours, including during lunch. To enhance the learning environment, no food will be allowed in the academic hallways. Additional students will not be permitted in the academic hallways during lunch hours without a pass from their teacher.

### EVACUATION/FIRE DRILL

The school is evacuated due to a safety concern inside of the building.

### SECURE PERIMETER

All exterior doors are locked in response to a concern of a threat outside of the building. Business is conducted as usual inside of the building.

### LOCKDOWN

Students and staff take immediate shelter in response to a concern of a threat inside of the building.

### SHELTER-IN-PLACE (SEVERE WEATHER)

Students and staff move to "tornado safe" areas on campus, which typically means on the first floor away from windows and doors.

Grandview High School is committed to providing a learning environment where students, staff and community members feel safe. This includes attention to both physical and psychological school safety. Each year, we revise our Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools (REMS) Template, which outlines important safety procedures we follow. This includes items such as our drill schedules and plans for preparation and response to potential school emergencies. On a regular basis we conduct Fire, Secure Perimeter, and Lockdown drills, and we continuously revisit and revise all safety procedures. All of our procedures are designed in accordance with recommendations of best practice made from both external agencies and the Cherry Creek School District. By establishing such proactive measure, and continually reflecting upon and adjusting our plans as needed, Grandview High School strives to promote and maintain a safe learning environment. Dear Parents/Guardians of 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Students:

We are excited about the opportunity to offer your student Grandview's One Pack 101 course. This course is designed to hone students' academic and social skills as they navigate the first few months of high school. In addition to Grandview-specific topics, students will also participate in lessons designed to arm them with skills in making healthy decisions, resisting drugs, maintaining positive attendance and academic habits, resisting drugs, and setting a strong foundation for a successful high school career. All 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will take One Pack 101 during the first 45 minutes of their resource period for the first 9 weeks of the school year. Students will earn .25 credits for their mandatory participation. At the conclusion of the course, students who meet the minimum requirements for passing One Pack 101 and maintain academic eligibility will earn their full resource period for the remainder of the year.

Freshman Seminar is a pass/fail course. In order to pass, students must do the following:

1. Attend class regularly. Freshman Seminar teachers will follow GHS policy for unexcused absences and tardies. Students are expected to make up all missed work due to absences. It is the student's responsibility to get work from teachers when absent.
2. Behave appropriately. Students are expected to be prompt, present, prepared, productive, polite, and participatory. Behavior issues will be referred to the assigned Dean of Students. Time missed for behavior issues must be made up and will be treated as an absence. Students will receive a Satisfactory (S) grade for completion of the course given the expectations listed above.

## ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE 2024-2025

### FALL 2024 Test Information

#### ➤ October 9, 2024 – College and Career Readiness Day (CCRD)

Wednesday, October 9th is College and Career Readiness Day. This will be a half-day for all students. This is a test day only; no regular classes will be held. Test dismissal is at 11:45 am. Lunch will be available in the cafeteria at the end of testing. Buses will depart at 12:15 pm. Please see specific grade level information below:

#### 9th Grade

- All freshmen will take the PSAT9 (Practice Scholastic Aptitude Test for 9th graders) with their Advisory class.

#### 10th Grade

- All Sophomores will take the PSAT10 (Practice Scholastic Aptitude Test for 10<sup>th</sup> graders) with their Advisory class.
- Sophomores who have registered and paid in advance to take the practice NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will also test this day.

#### 11th Grade

- Juniors will take the PSAT (Practice Scholastic Aptitude Test) with their Advisory Class.
- Juniors who have registered in advance to take the NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will also test. Please bring your school ID. Students may bring their own College Board approved calculator and a computer mouse to use while testing.

#### 12th Grade

- Seniors have the option to attend school for help on college essays and college applications, located in the Library. Interested students should sign up with their counselors through Schoology.
- Seniors who have registered for the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will also test. Students should see their counselor if interested.
- Seniors may be contacted to attend on this date to complete graduation requirements.

All Students are encouraged to utilize Khan Academy throughout the school year to access test prep materials.

#### **Additional Important College Board Testing Information:**

- Students must bring their school issued computers and chargers to school on October 11th. **Students should ensure that their computers are fully charged before testing.** Students who arrive at school without their computers cannot test.
- **Please ensure that your student's computer and the Bluebook testing app are updated before arriving at school on all test days (see attachments for instructions).**
- All students should have developed College Board account, which is needed to take the NMSQT test or practice SAT and PSAT tests. **Please practice logging into College Board with your student using their College Board user name and password, before arriving on October 9<sup>th</sup>.** The school is not able to access this information for students. Please have your student share this information with you, so it is readily available for all testing during their high school career. **If there are issues with your student's College Board account, please contact College Board directly at 866-315-6068.**

**Grandview High School values all tests as a measure of student progress and as an opportunity to show their learning. Your help in supporting testing is much appreciated.**

# TESTING INFORMATION

## NMSQT INFORMATION for Juniors

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) is an *optional* standardized assessment for Juniors that is co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). It is the only qualifying test for the National Merit® Scholarship Program, an academic competition for recognition and scholarships conducted by National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). For more information, visit [www.nationalmerit.org](http://www.nationalmerit.org).

Juniors can register for the PSAT/NMSQT by paying a \$25 fee through the Grandview student fees tile in ~~Revttrak~~. Sophomores may also register for the test, but it is *only considered a practice exam and is not a qualifying test for Sophomores*. Sophomores interested in an optional practice opportunity should contact their counselor for guidance on taking the exam.

The PSAT/NMSQT exam will be administered at Grandview on Wednesday, October 9, 2024. The exam will be in a digital format, and students *must use their school issued computer to test*. **Students interested in this assessment must register/pay by Wednesday, September 25, 2024.**

## SPRING 2025 Test Information

- **APRIL 16, 2025:**
  - **PSAT10 – 10th grade**
  - **SAT – 11th grade**
- **APRIL 17, 2025:**
  - **PSAT9 – 9th grade**
  - **CMAS – 11th grade**

The above tests are all FREE exams for students, and students are automatically registered for the test.

- There will be no regular classes on April 16<sup>th</sup> or 17<sup>th</sup>.
- School will be open for breakfast from 7:45 am – 8:15 am.
- Buses will run on a normal schedule in the morning and will depart GHS at 12:15 pm. Lunch will be available for students prior to bus departure.
- Seniors will not attend on either test day. It's recommended that seniors use this time to prepare for AP tests or final exams.

Please check your student's Seminar Schoology page for information on free test prep, developed by GHS teachers.

**Parents who wish to opt their child out of a PSAT9, PSAT10, SAT, or CMAS test** may do so by logging in to your [my.cherrycreekschools.org](http://my.cherrycreekschools.org) parent portal account and selecting parent exemption from state assessment form.
