## GRANDVIEW GIRLS' SOCCER – Spring 2025

Our 2025 season begins on February 24th. Girls that would like to play soccer this spring should refer to the information below.

#### ATHLETIC REGISTRATION IS OPENS LATER THIS SEMESTER!

Athletes that wish to play soccer in the spring must complete the online registration that is on the Grandview website: https://grandviewhs-ar.rschooltoday.com/node/26

The forms include in the athletics registration link on the school website (Athletics section), as well as a <u>physical</u> completed by a medical professional, <u>MUST be</u> completed no later than February 10th, 2025 so that girls will be eligible to participate in practices beginning on February 24th (our first official day). Please complete these forms ASAP after the link becomes active (December/January).

#### FIRST OFFICIAL PRACTICE DAY

Our first official practice date is Monday, February 24th, 2025. We will begin our tryout process on that date. Practice will be held outside on the grass fields at Grandview from 3:45 – 5:45 each day that week unless the fields are covered with snow. If fields are not playable then we will modify the schedule to utilize indoor spaces at Grandview. Players should be prepared to be outside on that date as well as have gear for indoor training if necessary.

#### PRESEASON CAMP

We will have a preseason camp for girls wishing to participate in our spring season starting on Thursday, January 16th. This camp is optional for players but highly recommended so that players are ready for the season. Here is information for this camp:

<u>Descriptiditioning</u> and skills camp will prepare players for the upcoming spring soccer season. The camp will focus on strength, injury prevention, conditioning, and technical work with a ball. Sessions will be held in the hallway or on the turf field when field and weather conditions permit. Athletes should wear running shoes and bring soccer cleats, shin guards, and a water bottle. Athletes should be prepared for both indoor and outdoor sessions.

#### **DEANS' CORNER**

Please excuse absences within 48 hours of absence and utilize the attendance line numbers. Excused absence means the student should be out of the building and off campus. Thank you for your support.

Grandview High School is a closed campus during the school day for all 9th graders, meaning 9th graders are not permitted to leave campus at any time. It is strongly encouraged (but not required) 10th graders remain on campus during regular school hours, including during lunch. To enhance the learning environment, no food will be allowed in the academic hallways. Additional students will not be permitted in the academic hallways during lunch hours without a pass from their teacher.

#### **SCHOOL SAFETY**

Grandview High School is committed to providing a learning environment where students, staff and community members feel safe. This includes attention to both physical and psychological school safety. Each year, we revise our Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools (REMS) Template, which outlines important safety procedures we follow. 
