

At the October PTO meeting a couple parents asked Mr. B for some gift suggestions for Christmas, let's see what he came up with...

For Kindies and 1st graders- I love KEVA planks. These deceptively simple "blocks" are laser cut and are all identical so you never have to worry about missing pieces. Also, the blocks are solid wood, which means they are incredibly hard to break, no matter how many times your towers tumble. 2. For second graders- It's time to introduce some pretty fun and interactive robotics to the mix- For a beginning robot I can't think of one better than the Dash and Dot from Wonder Robotics. We have these in class, and they work very well right out of the box which allows for some instant gratification. Once they are out however, they only get more for and interesting with options to program/code your


robots, allow them to interact with each other, and interact with their environment. Many expansion packs are available including musical and catapult options. - 3. For third graders- Moving back into hands on science- Take a look at most anything from Steve Spangler Science- <a href="https://www.stevespanglerscience.com/">https://www.stevespanglerscience.com/</a> A variety of hands on and amazing science experiments are included in the STEM science kit bundle which will keep your little scientist experimenting for weeks! Water science, electricity, physics, bubbles, and more are included in this ultra kit! These are demonstrations and experiements that I have been using for years in science museums around the country. Solid science that's actually really fun!
- 4. Fourth grade- This one is a little more for the techies in your life. Remember those old video games that took up way too much of your time when you were a kid? Thinking of Mario Brothers (yes the original), Legend of Zelda, Mega Man, Castleprevania, and other? Bloxels is a program that allows the gamer in your house to create, design, test, and share original games with a huge community of other builders. - 5. Fifth grade- LEGO SPIKE Robotics (Prime OR Essential). For casual coders who love LEGO or LEGO pros ready to kick things up a notch, there is a new LEGO robotics product in town. SPIKE replaces older kits like Mindstorms and WeDo and takes kids through over 100 different robotics activities and challenges. 

# Illness at School and Decreasing the Spread: How Can you Help?

Please keep your student/s home from school if they are feeling sick.

If your student has symptoms seen with COVID-19 (regardless of their vaccination status), they should not come to school.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include <u>ANY</u> of the following: Feeling feverish, having chills, temperature of 100.4 F or greater, new or worsening cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, loss of taste and smell, sore throat, runny nose or congestion, muscle aches, headache, fatigue, nausea or vomiting, and/or diarrhea.

We encourage anyone with symptoms to reach out to their healthcare provider and seek out COVID testing.

Seasonal Flu vaccines will be available at most sites after October 1<sup>st</sup>, but many grocery and drug stores have them available all year.

Please note, if your student has been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19 and is currently experiencing symptoms this leads to an automatic 10-day isolation per (Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE).

# **School of Choice**

The Cherry Creek School District allows its resident students to apply for enrollment in the Cherry Creek school of their choice. In other words, you may request that your child attend a Cherry Creek school outside your assigned attendance area. The School of Choice applications are an electronic form that you can access online from **January 1**<sup>st</sup> - **February 1**<sup>st</sup> from any computer, at any time -for acceptance to a school starting in the 2021-2022 school year.
