

Illness at School and Decreasing the Spread: How Can you Help?

Please keep your student/s home from school if they are feeling sick. If your student has symptoms seen with COVID-19 (regardless of their vaccination status), they should not come to school.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include ANY of the following: Feeling feverish, having chills, temperature of 100.4 F or greater, new or worsening cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, loss of taste and smell, sore throat, runny nose or congestion, muscle aches, headache, fatigue, nausea or vomiting, and/or diarrhea.

We encourage anyone with symptoms to reach out to their healthcare provider and seek out COVID testing.

No-cost COVID testing is available to anyone in the Cherry Creek community who needs a test:

The best way to prevent experiencing severe illness due to the COVID-19 virus or the upcoming seasonal flu (influenza) virus, is to get vaccinated.

Seasonal Flu vaccines will be available at most sites after October 1st, but many grocery and drug stores have them available all year.

PARKING LOT REMINDERS

As we continue to work on the drop-off and pick –up process, here are a few key things to keep in mind before and after school:

- Please do not exit your vehicle in the "kiss & go" lane
- Pull all the way forward for others to drop-off passengers
- Please do not cross the solid white line. There are two lanes of traffic, if you are in the drop-off only lane, *please be patient and wait* until the traffic continues moving.
- When picking your child up in the afternoon, please know the parking lot fills up quickly. Cars should only be parked in designated spots. Vehicles can't be left unattended in the fire lane, as this is a traffic violation.
- You can drive around the parking lot in a loop so you may stop momentarily for your child to get into your vehicle.
- Please remember to follow all traffic regulations by keeping crosswalks and driveways clear and leaving 8-10 feet from corner street curbs in the neighborhood.

MOST IMPORTANTLY—do NOT stop in the lane of traffic on Versailles to drop your student off at the back of the building. This is quite dangerous because on coming traffic coming over the crest of the hill can't see you until it's too late!

REMEMBER:

We dismiss 450 students in 15 minutes!!
