Arrival/Dismissal/Attendance Reminders

Please remember that we have a soft start beginning at 7:45 a.m., and school starts promptly at 8:00 a.m. Do not drop your students off any earlier than 7:45 a.m. as there is no supervision outside the entry doors before then. All students must be fever-free (fever = 100.4* or higher) without fever-reducing medication for **24 hours** <u>and</u> feeling well enough to participate in school.

They also must stay home until it has been <u>24 hours</u> since their last episode of vomiting and/or diarrhea *and* eating and drinking before returning to school.


