Feeder Overview

Third oldest feeder in the district, home to:

- 6,780 students (approx.)
- 5 elementary schools
- 1 middle schools
- Challenge School
- Overland High School (constructed in 1978)

Holly Ridge & Holly Hills Rebuild

- Construct one new PK-5 school to accommodate two schools
- Third and fourth oldest
 elementary schools: Holly Hills
 (1958) / Holly Ridge (1962)

Estimated Timeline

- Initial design complete
- Estimated construction timeline of 15 months, contingent on passage of bond

Community Outreach

- Student/family surveys; community meetings; tour of CCIC
- Pathways determined by industry/economic data, students surveys & community feedback

Safety & Security

Safety and security is our number one priority and we continue to prioritize investments in trained security personnel and safety upgrades to school buildings.

In the 2024 proposed bond, every school building would receive:

- Security Camera Replacement
- Access Control System Replacement

Why now?

- 75-year-old district comes with aging buildings
 - 68 out of 89 buildings are 20+ years old
 - 21 schools are 40+ years old
- Continuing inflation and construction costs
- Protecting and maximizing taxpayer investment in community assets
